FIRE SUPPRESSION PROGRAM INFORMATION

The Fire Suppression Program at Chemeketa's Brooks Center offers an eight-term Associate of Applied Science degree that combines classroom, lab, and hands-on training at one of the most advanced facilities on the West Coast. Students will:

- Practice safety as part of a response team during training and emergency calls
- Communicate effectively in both emergency and non-emergency situations
- Support risk reduction through hazard identification and public education
- Work collaboratively in fire station operations

Students serve as on-duty Chemeketa student firefighters for 24-hour shifts every sixth day during Fall, Winter, and Spring terms. Shifts run 24/7 in partnership with fire agencies in Marion, Polk, and Yamhill Counties. In Summer, students complete five weeks of Cooperative Work Experience (CWE) with fire agency partners. Graduates earn an AAS in Fire Suppression, an EMT-Basic license, and DPSST certifications in:

- NFPA HazMat Awareness & Operations
- NFPA Firefighter I & II
- NFPA Apparatus Driver/Operator
- NFPA Apparatus Equipped with Fire Pump
- Entry-Level Wildland Firefighting

FIRE SUPPRESSION SELECTION PROCESS OVERVIEW

The Fire Suppression Program is a limited enrollment program with a maximum of 54 positions. Incoming availability is based on the total program capacity minus the number of continuing students. To determine eligibility, refer to the "Who May Apply" section on the next page. Students are selected after completing the XFRP5001A – Fire Suppression Selection Process course, offered each Summer Term. Selection is based on the FireTEAM written exam, oral board interview, and CPAT testing (pass/fail). Selected students begin Fire Program classes in Fall Term. The pathway below outlines the steps required for admission to the Fire Suppression Program.



INFORMATION SESSIONS

The Information Session will discuss the Fire Suppression Program and expectations, FireTEAM test, local resident volunteer programs and provide an in-depth CPAT (physical fitness test) orientation.

WHO MAY APPLY

Requirement Description of Requirement

Minimum Age Applicants must be at least 18 years old starting from the first day of the fall term.

No exceptions will be made.

Secondary Education

or GED

Applicants must have graduated from high school or obtained a GED. Acceptable

records include: transcripts (with graduation date), diploma, certificate, or records

of completion.

Academic Accepted as a student at Chemeketa Community College and have received a

Preparedness college "K" number.

Driving Record A valid driver's license is required. Applicants must be able to furnish a certified

copy of their driving record showing no more than two convictions for moving violations, two chargeable accidents, or any combination of two within the past three years, and no alcohol- or drug-related moving violation within the past five years. All periods are calculated from the date of the first scheduled class in the

beginning term.

Criminal Conviction Persons with a criminal record of crimes against people, violent crimes, or multiple

convictions may be disqualified. If you have such a conviction, contact the Program

Chair or the Dean of Emergency Services and Diesel Technology.

Medical Examination If selected for a position in the program, you will be required to submit proof of a

medical examination pursuant to NFPA standards for firefighters. Copies of these

standards are available from program staff.

Immunizations If selected for a position in the program, you must submit proof of immunization for

chickenpox, measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, and you must have at least the first in a series of immunizations for Hepatitis B. A negative tuberculosis (TB) test result is also required. Details for submitting records will be provided during Program Orientation. Note: COVID-19 vaccinations rules are constantly changing within the healthcare and emergency services industries. Please check with staff about the current requirements for COVID-19 vaccinations. Further information will be provided during Fire Suppression Program Orientation for those students selected.

APPLYING FOR CHEMEKETA ADMISSION

In order to register for the Fire Suppression Selection Process course, you must first be a Chemeketa Community College Student. Read the below section that best describes your student status.

CURRENT "ACTIVE" CHEMEKETA STUDENTS:

If you do not have any holds on your account that prevent you from registering, please complete Step 1 on page 7 when your Registration Status allows you to register. Your Registration Status can be viewed in your MyChemeketa account, under Registration. If you have holds on your account and need assistance with registration, please contact Enrollment Services (503.399.5001) or Academic Advising (503.399.5120).

FIRST-TIME CHEMEKETA STUDENTS:

First step:

- Apply for admission
 - Select the "Starting Term" as Summer 2026. This is important because the free non-credit course that takes you through the selection process is during the first five weeks of Summer Term. If selected for the Fire Program, you will start your program courses in the Fall Term.

Next step: Expect the admission process to take **five to fifteen business days** before you receive notification that you have been accepted as a Chemeketa student. Once accepted, you can continue the following steps at https://www.chemeketa.edu/admission/enroll/first-time-college-student/

- Set up your Chemeketa student account.
- Explore ways to pay for college.
- Placement assessments
 - Estimated processing time: several weeks, depending on the time of year.
- New student orientation
 - Available in-person or online
- New student advising
 - Book your appointment as soon as possible. Depending on the time of year students may have to book an appointment several weeks in advance.

FIRE SUPPRESSION SELECTION PROCESS COURSE

The Fire Suppression Program is a limited enrollment program. This means there is a competitive process to determine which students will be admitted. The selection process is conducted during the first five weeks of Summer Term through the XFRP5001A – Fire Suppression Selection Process course. If selected for the Fire Suppression Program, students will begin program courses in Fall Term. Registration begins in May, depending on your Registration Status, which can be viewed in your MyChemeketa account under Registration. Follow the instructions later in this packet to ensure eligibility and learn more about what the course includes.

- Select Summer under Terms Open for Registration and click CONTINUE
- Click the Enter CRNs tab

To be prepared for the Fire Suppression Selection Process course, you must complete all of the following steps **before the start of Summer Term**. It is recommended that you begin several weeks or months in advance to ensure everything is in place by the first day of class. **No exceptions will be made to any deadlines.** See page 5 for Important Dates and Checklist.

MUST BE COMPLETE BY JUNE 22, 2026

STEP 2 Collect or complete the information below:

- Have a digital copy of your current driver's license available.
- Obtain your electronic DMV driving record "3-Year Employment Driving Record (Certified)"
 - For Oregon DMV records visit: https://www.oregon.gov/odot/dmv/pages/records/available.aspx
 - o Download and save. This information will be needed for the selection process.
 - o Note: There is a cost associated with obtaining driving records in Oregon.
 - If outside of Oregon, follow your states DMV policy for obtaining your driving record.
- Obtain a copy of your High School or GED completion records.
 - Acceptable records include transcripts (with graduation date), diploma or certificate.

 - o In-person test dates will be held at the Brooks Center:

 - If you are not able to attend either session, you must arrange to take the test virtually or at another authorized testing location.

 - Testing dates fill up quickly, it is best to schedule your test at least two weeks in advance. Testing must be completed prior to June 22, 2026.

SUMMER TERM STARTS – JUNE 22, 2026

When Summer Term begins, it is time to start the Fire Suppression Selection Process course. Candidates must complete each step in order to move on to the next. The following steps will guide you through accessing the course, uploading required documentation, and signing up for your Oral Board Interview and CPAT test. Students who successfully complete the entire selection process and are selected will receive notification of their acceptance into the program via their MyChemeketa email on **July 22, 2026**.

STEP 3 Access the Fire Suppression Selection Process course in Canvas:

- Log into your MyChemeketa account
- Click the "eLearn" button on the top right-side of the screen
- From your Dashboard, select the course
- Continue below with STEP 4

STEP 4 - MUST BE COMPLETED BY JUNE 25, 2026

STEP 4 Once you have accessed the Fire Suppression Selection course in Canvas:

- Read the Introduction Module
- Complete Module 1
 - o Fill out the Fire Suppression Application
- Complete Module 2 by uploading the following documentation:
 - Placement Assessment Results
 - Copy of Driver's License
 - Copy of your Driving Record
 - Copy of your High School or GED completion records.
- Complete Module 3 (If applicable)
 - Transcript Evaluation for Prior College Courses
- Complete Module 4
 - Documentation of payment for the \$40.00 (Non-refundable) Application Fee to apply for the Fire Suppression Program.

Selection Process:

Selections are based on the FireTEAM written examination, oral board interview, and CPAT testing (pass/fail). Due to the competitive nature of the program and the number of applicants, cuts may be made at each step of the selection process. Only those who successfully complete each step and continue to meet selection criteria will move forward in the process.

Only those selected for CONSIDERATION in the upcoming class will complete Step 5.

(Those selected will receive notification by MyChemeketa email on June 29, 2026.)

STEP 5 Schedule your Oral Board Interview in Canvas with the instructions in Module 5.

- Interviews must be scheduled by July 2, 2026.
- During the interview candidates will be asked a series of questions by a panel made up of Emergency Services staff and Fire Service professionals.
- NOTE: If you arrive after your scheduled interview time, you will not be able to interview or continue with the selection process.

Only those selected for CONSIDERATION in the upcoming class will complete Steps 6.

(Those selected will receive notification by MyChemeketa email on July 9, 2026.)

STEP 6 Schedule your CPAT Test in Canvas with the instructions in Module 6.

- CPAT Tests must be scheduled by <u>July 16, 2026</u>.
- NOTE: If you arrive after your scheduled test time, you will not be able to test or continue with the selection process.

Note: DO NOT schedule this test through NTN. This is an unofficial CPAT provided to Chemeketa Fire Program candidates only as part of this selection process.

Only those SELECTED in the upcoming class will complete Step 7.

(Those selected will receive notification by MyChemeketa email on July 22, 2026.)

- STEP 7 Candidates that are selected for the Fire Suppression Program must attend the in-person

 Mandatory Fire Suppression Program Orientation on July 24, 2026, from 8:00am to 4:00pm.

 Orientation will provide information and instruction for the following:
 - Shift assignments and shift calendar
 - Students in the Fire Suppression Program are on duty as a Chemeketa student firefighter for a 24-hour period every sixth day during Fall, Winter and Spring terms. While academic classes are in session, student shifts operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week, responding to emergencies with partnering fire agencies in Marion, Polk and Yamhill Counties. Summer terms students will be assigned to shifts for five weeks for Cooperative Work Experience (CWE) with partnering fire agencies.

PARAMEDIC BRIDGE CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

This limited enrollment certificate program is open to selected students who meet the following criteria: possess an associate's or bachelor's degree from an accredited college/university, hold a current Oregon EMT license, and are actively working in the EMS or fire career field or are recent graduates of the Chemeketa Fire Suppression Program. This pathway to a Paramedic License prepares competent entry-level paramedics in the cognitive (knowledge), psychomotor (skills), and affective (behavior) learning domains through comprehensive education. The program ensures that each candidate is prepared for emergency responses and critical patient encounters with confidence and the ability to perform according to current industry expectations.

FIREFIGHTER TESTING SYSTEM (FireTEAM) REGISTRATION

- Go to the National Testing Network (NTN) website at: <u>nationaltestingnetwork.com</u>
 - During this process you will be asked to make an account with the NTN, if you do not have one already. If you already have an account log into your preexisting account when prompted.
 - Current price of the test is \$65.00. (This is subject to change, visit NTNs website for a current price list.)
- If you have taken this test in the past six months, please contact Allison Sebern.
- Click the "Find Jobs" tab at the top of the page
- For Job Class select Firefighter
- For State select Oregon
- Click the "Update" button
- Check Chemeketa Community College-Fire Protection
- Click the "Continue" button and "That is All I Want" button.
- Next verify that you qualify by selecting "I qualify. Continue." and click the "Continue" button.
- Select from the two types of testing options
 - Virtual Testing (see Page 13 for additional information)
 - Select "Virtual Testing" and click the "Continue" button.
 - Select a date and time that works best for you.
 - Click the "Continue" button.
 - Read all of the Virtual Testing Instructions carefully and then click the "Continue" button.
 - Continue to follow prompts to complete your test selection.
 - In-Person Testing
 - Select the physical testing center that you would like to test in-person at and then click the "Continue" button. (If prompted with a reminder click the "Continue" button.)
 - Select a date and time that works best for you.
 - Click the "Continue" button.
 - Continue to follow prompts to complete your test selection.
- You will be prompted to complete a self-assessment after you have signed up for your test. The self-assessment must be completed by the start of summer term.

• By the first day of Summer Term

Do I need to complete the Self-Assessment?

• Yes, the self-assessment must be completed by the beginning of Summer Term.

What does the FireTEAM test consist of?

FIREFIGHTER TESTING SYSTEM (FireTEAM)

There are four components to the FireTEAM Testing System: a human relations test, a mechanical aptitude test, a math test and a reading ability test. Total Test Time: Approximately 2 hours

Human Relations Test

Part I

The Human Relations Test focuses on teamwork and human relations skills and was specifically designed for firefighters. Candidates watch a video segment and then choose the best course of action in a multiple-choice format. The test items play without stopping.

Part II

Candidates are instructed to pay attention to the behaviors of the individual firefighters and supervisors portrayed in the Human Relations test, then answer questions about the characters. Part II immediately follows Part I.

Mechanical Test

The Mechanical Test is a multiple-choice mechanical aptitude test presented on video. Candidates see detailed introductions to an animated brick-making factory, then are asked questions about the factory. Most of the questions are about basic mechanical objects and principles such as valves and water pressure. They are also asked to answer troubleshooting type questions and observe system operations for problems. All of the questions can be answered based on common sense and observation of how everyday objects work.

Reading Test

This test is designed specifically for firefighters, a job requiring ongoing study of difficult and technical materials. Candidates are required to choose a word that best fits in the blank.

Math Test

This math test is designed specifically for firefighters. The questions are presented on video. Candidates must complete the calculations in their heads. No written calculation is permitted. Questions are based on the type of math that firefighters must use on a regular basis as part of the job. Basic areas covered include: addition, subtraction, multiplication, division and proportions.

Partial list of Instruction:

- You must download and use the NTN kiosk to take your exam! There are specific system requirements that are required in order to take the test that are listed on the link above.
- Any object other than what is needed to take the exam is NOT allowed. This includes but is not limited to:
 - Using the restroom during your exam is NOT allowed.
 - Multiple monitors are NOT allowed.
 - Wireless headphones or wireless earbuds are NOT allowed.
 - Cell phones or other electronic devices are NOT allowed in the room with you.
 - Sunglasses and hats are NOT allowed.
 - o Food and drink are NOT allowed.
 - Vape pens and/or any type of smoking are NOT allowed.
 - Paper and pencil or pens are NOT allowed. (You will be provided an area to type notes needed during the exam).
- Taking The Exam
 - All virtual testing exam times are in Pacific time.
 - You must take the test in a private room with the door closed. No one else can be in the room
 or enter the room during the test.
 - Your computer can only have one monitor (screen).
 - You are required to log into the kiosk to take your virtual exam at least 30 minutes before your scheduled test time.
 - Before you begin testing, reboot your computer, then close all programs in your tray and disable screen savers. Any program that produces alerts must be shut down. Leave all programs closed until you are done testing.
 - The following will be monitored and recorded while the kiosk program is running:
 - Programs running on your computer
 - Your video
 - Your audio
 - Your actions in the exam and proctor windows
 - Your desktop
 - Test sessions can last up to three (3) hours. Take care of personal needs (i.e., food, restroom) before testing begins.
 - If your webcam cannot clearly show your ID details you will not be able to test.
 - You must wear clothing. Clothing tops and bottoms are required to join a virtual test session. A
 Casual Dress Code is acceptable as long as the clothing is not revealing and does not allow more
 of the wearer's body to be seen than is usual. No hats/head covering, thick glasses,
 wristwatches or unnecessarily bulky clothing.

PHYSICAL ABILITY TESTING - CPAT

Candidates must take part in a physical abilities test as part of the selection process. Chemeketa Fire Program uses the CPAT for measuring an individual's ability to handle the physical demands of being a firefighter. An unofficial CPAT is provided to Chemeketa Fire Program candidates only as part of this selection process and is <u>not</u> scheduled through NTN. **NOTE: Candidates that hold a current NTN passing test result may submit a copy of their results to Chemeketa staff and may not be required to complete another test.**

The Candidate Physical Abilities Test (CPAT)

The CPAT was designed by fire fighters for fire fighters and endorsed by both the International Association of Fire Chiefs (IAFC) and the International Association of Fire Fighters (IAFF). The CPAT consists of eight events directly related to the job of fire fighter. Candidates complete each of the events in a predetermined path from one event to another. The events are placed in a sequence that simulates fire scene events.

The events consist of:

- 1. Stair climb
- 2. Hose drag
- 3. Equipment carry
- 4. Ladder raise and extension
- 5. Forcible entry
- 6. Search
- 7. Rescue
- 8. Ceiling breach and pull

During the events, candidates wear a 50-lb vest to simulate the weight of self-contained breathing apparatus and firefighter protective clothing. An additional 25 pounds is added to the candidate's shoulders during the stair climb event to simulate carrying a high-rise pack. The CPAT Orientation sessions give candidates an opportunity to preview each event. They have the opportunity to try out the weighted vests, the individual events and ask questions.

Throughout all events, candidates must wear long pants, a hard hat with chinstrap, work gloves and appropriate footwear with no open heel or toe. Watches and loose or restrictive jewelry are not permitted. Candidates will not be allowed to participate in the testing process without the appropriate attire. The Chemeketa staff will provide the hard hat and work gloves for use during the test.

The Firefighter CPAT is very strenuous. If you have had a recent illness, injury, surgery or are under medication, consult with your healthcare provider to determine if you should participate in the CPAT.
